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
Why telc exams at your school?

Internationally recognised examinations based on the EU's Common European Framework of Reference for Languages

- telc at school provides the opportunity for schoolkids to be developed in line with their gifts and interests.

- To prepare for the exam, there are practice tests at all levels, as well as a wide range of further material for teachers and students (www.telc.net).
- Schools may define the dates on which they wish for exams to be held.

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telc Deutsch A1 Junior

is an exam for children aged around 12. The test provides confirmation that level A1 has been attained. The test also provides a smoother path to taking further external language tests and exams.

Level: at level A1, youngsters can already make themselves understood in a simple way in concrete situations (e.g. introducing oneself, eating and drinking, shopping, living). They can apply some simple grammatical structures.

The exam consists of a written and oral part. The written part lasts 40 minutes, while the oral exam is normally performed without preparatory time immediately after the written exam.

Exam fee CHF 160.-

telc Deutsch A2 Schule

is designed for youngsters aged from 12 to 15 years old.

Level: schoolkids at this level can express themselves in a simple manner in general day-to-day subjects. They can hold conversations on familiar matters, and apply simple grammatical structures correctly.

The exam consists of a written and oral part. The written part lasts 80 minutes. Prior to the oral exam, candidates have 15 minutes to prepare. The oral exam may be taken on the same day as the written part or on another day.

Exam fee CHF 160.-

telc B1 Schule

is targeted at youngsters aged from 12 to 15 years old.

Level: at B1 level, youngsters can already make themselves understood in a simple, logical manner with regard to day-to-day situations, travel, and in areas of personal interest. They can talk about experiences, describe their goals and defend their points of view. They can generally apply the most important grammatical structures correctly.

The exam consists of a written and oral part. The written part lasts 2 hours 30 minutes. Prior to the oral exam, candidates have 20 minutes to prepare. The oral exam may be taken on the same day as the written part or on another day.

Exam fee CHF 260.-

At least 6 participants per exam type. Exam dates upon agreement.

All the above exams may be taken in French and Spanish as well.
